<b>Eyes</b>	Causes serious eye irritation. Overexposure can cause redness and burning sensation.
<b>Skin</b>	Causes skin irritation. Overexposure will cause defatting of skin.
<b>Inhalation</b>	Causes irritation, nausea, headache, dizziness and loss of coordination. Overexposure can cause unconsciousness and even death.
<b>Ingestion</b>	Nausea, vomiting and gastrointestinal distress

**Section 4. First Aid Measures**

<b>Eye Contact</b>	Rinse cautiously with clean water for at least 15 minutes holding open eyelids. Remove contact lenses if present and easy to do. If irritation persists, get medical advice or attention.
<b>Skin Contact</b>	Remove all contaminated clothing; wash before reuse. Wash skin with water for at least 15 minutes. Call a poison center or doctor if you feel unwell.
<b>Inhalation</b>	Remove person to fresh air. Call a poison center or doctor if you feel unwell.
<b>Ingestion</b>	Rinse mouth. Do not induce vomiting. Immediately call a poison center or physician. If vomiting occurs, lie on your side in the recovery position. Never give anything orally to an unconscious person.

<b>Hazardous Combustion Products</b>	CO and CO <sub>2</sub>
<b>Extinguishing Media</b>	Water, fog, dry chemical or carbon dioxide
<b>Unsuitable Extinguishing Media</b>	Water may be ineffective but can be used to cool containers
<b>Fire Fighting Procedures</b>	Stop spill/release if it can be done without risk. Move undamaged containers if it can be done safely. Contents under pressure. Keep away from ignition sources and open flames. Exposure to extreme heat and flames can cause them to rupture often with violent force. Wear fire fighting equipment and self containing breathing apparatus.

**Section 6. Accidental Release Measures**

**Spill Clean Up** Wear appropriate personal protective equipment. Avoid contact with eyes skin and clothing. Avoid breathing vapor. Isolate area. Stop spill/release if it can be done without risk. Prevent spilled material from entering sewers, storm drains and waterways. Eliminate all ignition sources. Avoid contact with spilled material. Do not touch or walk through spilled material. Clean up immediately. Use absorbent sweeping compound to soak up material and put into suitable container for disposal.

**Handling and Storage** For industrial use only. Keep away from children. Always wear appropriate personal protective equipment when handling. Wash hands after use. Do not cut, drill, grind or perform similar tasks near the aerosol cans. Do not get in eyes, on skin or on clothing. Do not breathe in vapors. Do not eat, drink or smoke while using product. Store in a cool, dry place. Protect from sunlight. Empty containers retain residue that may be dangerous.
